Learning from the Story of Thomas

• God can turn our doubt into faith. Everyone has doubts about God from time to time.

That's not a bad thing. That's just how it goes. We worship a God we cannot see with our eyes. We can't touch Him with our hands, and we can't hear His voice with our ears. It's only natural that we would have our doubts that there's someone up in Heaven listening to our prayers who loves us and cares for us. God isn't upset with us when we doubt him. When we have our doubts, God sees an opportunity to grow our faith. When we give our doubts to God, when we seek him with all our hearts, He shows up.

Jesus promised that when we seek Him with all our hearts, we will find him. Don't let doubt discourage you from seeking God. Use that

doubt to ask questions, to pray harder, to look with all your heart. Jesus will be there to comfort you and give you faith.

Trust God. Thomas had big questions about whether Jesus was alive or not. It's OK to

have questions. Trust is believing without knowing absolutely everything. Thomas loved Jesus, but he was struggling with believing without

Jesus drives out fear. The disciples were hiding behind closed doors

because they were afraid. When Jesus entered the room and spoke "peace be with you" their fears were gone.



Life can be tough, confusing, joyful, sad or any range of emotions. Kids need a way of releasing how they are feeling to God.. Let's encourage them to journal their thoughts and talk about those feelings with God on a daily basis. God understands. He cares about us and wants us to bring our fears, hopes and experiences to Him. A journaling page is provided as an additional page (OR any piece of paper will do) Younger children can draw pictures.
